SCHOOLDOCS

Our school uses SchoolDocs, a web based platform for all our school policies and procedures. SchoolDocs provides us with a comprehensive core set of policies, which have been well researched and align with the National Education and Learning Priorities. The policies and procedures are tailored to our school, and the school supplies specific information such as our strategic plan, procedures for behaviour management and reporting to parents, etc.

SchoolDocs updates, modifies, or creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, significant events, reviews/requests from schools, and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. There is a regular cycle of policy review and you can log into the site to view policies and take part in reviews.

HEALTHY FOOD AT SCHOOL

Wiri Central School is part of the Fruit in Schools programme and the Ka Ora, Ka Ako lunch programme. Every child receives a free piece of fruit every day and there is often extra fruit available in the classroom for anyone who wants it. The free, healthy lunches are delivered daily to classrooms.

The purpose of these programmes is to:

- ensure every child has healthy food to eat at school as this supports them to focus better on learning
- save busy whānau time and money by not having to provide food for school

STAFF ONLY DAY - FRIDAY 31 MAY

The Ministry of Education allocated four staff only days across 2023 and 2024 to enable teachers to participate in professional learning about changes to the New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa. We held two days in 2023 and will hold the other two in 2024. The first staff only day for 2024 will be held on Friday 31 May (preceding King's Birthday weekend). School will be closed for students on this date.
