NEW STAFF AND CLASS CHANGES FOR TERM 3

As we approach Term 3 I want to let you know about some class changes that will be happening from the start of Term 3. These changes are due to our growing roll and the commitment of our school board to maintain lower class numbers.

Roopū Pūkeko (Year O-2) will be growing to a fifth class. The new teacher in Room 4 will be Mrs Sandy Udaar. To reduce class numbers across the roopū, some students from Rooms 1, 2, and 3 will be moving to Room 4. Ms Charlotte-Rose Ruddell (Room 2 teacher) will be on leave for the remainder of 2024. The replacement teacher in Room 2 will be Mrs Gaganpreet Kour. A new Year 5/6 class will be starting in Roopū Toroa (Year 5-8). Mrs Hema Patel will be the teacher located in Room 6. Some students from Rooms 7, 8 and 9 will be moving classes as we

reduce class sizes across Roopū Torua.

<u>MATARIKI</u>

Matariki is a special occasion in the New Zealand calendar which marks the start of the Māori New Year. Signified by the Matariki cluster of stars reappearing in our night sky, this is a time to reflect on the past year, celebrate the present, and plan for the year ahead.

This year the Matariki public holiday is being held this Friday, 28 June. **There is no school on Friday.**

There is a local community celebration taking place at Matukutureia on Thursday 27th June (see the flyer alongside). This is open to anyone who wishes to attend. As part of learning about Matariki at school students will be encouraged to reflect on the past year and set some new goals. With half the school year completed and half still ahead of us, this is the perfect time for reflection and goal setting. We will also be acknowledging Matariki at Wiri Central School with a sausage sizzle for students on arrival at school on the morning of Thursday 4 July.
