Below is an excerpt from the report received from Harrison Tew following the lockdown exercise.

On the 23rd and 24th September 2024, Wiri Central School completed the entire full school training of their new Emergency Management Plan which included conducting a full lockdown exercise.

The staff and students should be congratulated for the way they followed the correct procedures and at the speed at which the school was placed into lockdown. This was followed by a full school evacuation where everyone was safely accounted for.

It is with pleasure that I would like to pass on to the Board of Trustees, that following the recent training and exercise provided by Harrison Tew[®], you should have full confidence that the Wiri Central School Senior Leadership Team have demonstrated knowledge and confidence to deal with a wide range of emergencies and incidents, intending to keep their students, staff, and visitors to the school safe.


TALKING MATTERS
