- 1. Every moment is a talking moment
- 2. 'Strive for 5' back and forth in a conversation
- 3. Ask fewer questions gift more words
- 4. Use and promote 'juicy' words, complex words that stretch thinking
- 5. Expect more kids are enormously capable and learn incredibly fast

It is important for your child to start school on or soon after their fifth birthday. Children get a better start to learning if they start school as soon as they turn five years old. You are more than welcome to come into school before your child's fifth birthday. This is an opportunity to see what paperwork is required and to have a look at the class before your child starts.
